WHY THE CODE?

As a Precinct we share a set of values that we express as being a good, kind human towards those around us. We value care, respect, accountability and an ethical approach to how we conduct ourselves.

This Code of Conduct outlines behaviors we expect of you and everyone on our site, and what we do not tolerate.

Everyone who works at, or attends the Construction Training Centre (CTC),

- has **obligations** to keep themselves and others physically and psychologically safe while here
- has the right to be and feel physically and psychologically safe while here

This Code of Conduct was agreed between the CTC and its tenants to ensure that the CTC Precinct is a safe and welcoming environment for students, staff, contractors and visitors. It also ensures our precinct complies with the Qld Government's Code of Practice for managing psychosocial hazards in the workplace (2022).

WHO DOES IT APPLY TO?

This applies to each and every person who visits the Precinct, for whatever purpose or however long. This includes staff, students, contractors, visitors and delivery personnel.

WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES IF THE CODE IS BREACHED?

We will talk to you directly about any behaviours that contravene our Code of Conduct. Consequences for breaching the Code include:

- Having the behavior called out;
- The behavior/incident being reported to someone's employer;
- Asking someone to leave the Precinct for the remainder of the day;
- Towing of vehicles where they are parked in an unauthorised location; and
- Tyre clamping of a vehicle breaching the code;
- Banning a vehicle from accessing or parking on the Precinct; and
- Asking someone to leave the Precinct and banning them from returning for a period of time, or permanently.

CTC is within its legal rights to undertake these actions and if a member of the CTC Team requests someone to leave the Precinct they must do so immediately (after a reasonable period of time to retrieve their property). Failure to do so makes that person a trespasser and the Police can be called to have the person removed.

HOW CAN CODE OF CONDUCT BREACHES BE REPORTED?

A principal on the Precinct is "Don't Walk By" remembering the behaviour we walk by is the behaviour we are prepared to tolerate. This means that those who observe or are made aware of behaviour which falls below the standards we set should be called out and/or reported. Every person on the Precinct should feel empowered to do this where they feel safe to do so.

You can report unacceptable behaviour in a number of ways:

- 1. Call CTC direct on (07) 3216 6711;
- 2. Speak to your trainer if a student;
- 3. Speak to your manager if a tenant staff member; and
- 4. Reporting the matter through the Safety Reporting Portal (SRP) either identifying yourself or



Tenanted Areas and Access

That a person does not enter a tenanted area unless they have a reason to be there.	 A person entering a tenant's premises they have no entitlement or reason to visit, A person who has been banned from the Precinct returning to the Precinct as a trespasser, Someone who has been asked to leave the Precinct remaining longer than required to retrieve their property, Loitering, Failing to move on when requested, Hawking, Proselytising, Rifling through bins to retrieve containers for change bottles and cans,



What we expect	What we don't tolerate	
• That toilets are a safe place for those who use them.	 Sexual activity, Smoking of cigarettes (and e-cigarettes), Consumption of alcohol, illegal drugs and other illegal substances, More than one person per cubicle, The presence of a person who is not of (or genuinely identifies as) the gender assigned to that toilet, Deliberate defecation outside of a toilet bowl, Standing or squatting on a toilet to 'do your business'. For cultural reasons if squatting is the preferred option then CTC has 'squatty potties' to enable this technique to occur safely.
